

# Secondary Uniform Policy

**Hairstyles: Years 7 to 11** 

Hair no shorter than a "number 2" cut and no razor-cut lines. Longer styles must be tied back with a navy elastic.. No unnatural hair colours allowed and no extreme hairstyles. No headscarves except for religious or cultural reasons

## **Uniform Years 7 to 11**

Long or short DARK grey school trousers. BST blue tartan skirt, (no more than 10cm above the knee)

BST official blue polo t-shirt BST official navy-blue sweater BST official navy-blue jacket Navy blue, black or grey socks, navy-blue tights

Plain navy or black school shoes (not material/canvas) with dark soles.

Navy blue hair band or elastic.

No headscarves except for religious or cultural reasons

The above uniform is worn daily except on the day your child has P.E. lessons.

All items of the school uniform MUST be labelled clearly!

## **Anoraks**:

During cold weather students will be allowed to wear a plain dark navy-blue anorak over the <u>official</u> school jacket. Please note that the anorak must not have any form of large logo.

Caps or hats can be worn outdoors but must be removed on entering the school building.

"Hoodies" can be worn <u>under</u>the school jacket, but the hood must be down once the student enters school.

Sunglasses may be worn outside; however the school is not responsible for damage or loss.

Students who wear inappropriate school uniform will have these items confiscated until the end of the day.

# P.E. Uniform:

The <u>official</u> school tracksuit comprises of a navy-blue tracksuit, navy blue shorts and a light blue t-shirt. Students must wear white or black sports socks only.

Senior students must bring 2 official P.E. t-shirts to school on the day they have sports. They are required to change into a clean school t-shirt, at the sports centre, after the lesson.

The correct footwear is white, blue or black sports trainers (fluorescent trainers are not allowed).

Trainers should not have black soles.

No skateboarding shoes or canvas shoes to be worn. Students who do not wear the correct P.E uniform will not be allowed to participate in P.E lessons.

Shorts MUST be worn during sports lessons

(Tights may **not** be worn under P.E. shorts).

Jewellery MUST be removed for P.E lessons.

All items of the school uniform MUST be labelled clearly

# **Jewellery**

2 rings

# A watch - SMARTWATCHES ARE PROHIBITED IN SCHOOL, even for Sixth Form students

No more than three bracelets to be worn.

One chain necklace (no other type of necklace may be worn)

Earrings must be stud earrings and no more than 2 pairs may be worn

No facial piercings or visible tattoos

Nail polish is prohibited in years 7-9

Fingernails must be trimmed (no longer than 5mm). Fake nails are forbidden

The uniform policy must be strictly adhered to. Students will be asked to remove jewellery if it does not conform to the above. If an item of jewellery is confiscated, it will be returned at the end of the school day. If a student repeatedly flaunts this rule, then jewellery will be returned at the end of the school day, but a detention will also be given.

## **YEAR 12/13**

Students in these year groups do not wear school uniform. They should, however, remember that they are still studying in a school and wear appropriate clothing.

No flip flops.

No spaghetti strap tops, crop-tops, see-through clothing or shorts/skirts of an inappropriate length (more than 10cm above the knee)

No vest tops are to be worn.

Clothing with inappropriate slogans is also not permitted in school.

Excessively ripped jeans/shorts are not allowed.

Caps or hats must be removed on entering the school building.

No facial piercings or visible tattoos.

It is at the discretion of the school management to decide if what a student is wearing is suitable for school or not. If clothing is considered offensive, then the student will be sent home to change. In the event that the student is unable to go home he/shewill be placed in isolation for the remainder of the day.

The School Management reserves the right to review and amend these regulations at any moment.
